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SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

General fire hazards: None known

Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguish media: Applicable fire extinguishing agent: Extinguish the fire with water spray jet, alcohol-resistant foam, carbon dioxide fire extinguisher.

Unsuitable extinguishing media: None known.

Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture: Under conditions giving incomplete combustion, hazardous gases produced may consist of: carbon monoxide (CO), carbon dioxide (CO₂).
Combustion gases of organic materials must in principle be graded as inhalation poisons. Vapours are heavier than air and may spread along floors.

Advice for firefighters

Put out the fire in the upwind direction.
Fire fighter protection should include a self-contained breathing apparatus (NIOSH-approved or EN 133) and full fire-fighting turn out gear.
Cool containers / tanks with water spray.
Dike and collect water used to fight fire.
Keep people away from and upwind of fire.
Collect contaminated fire extinguishing water separately, it could not be discharged into the sewer to prevent environmental pollution.
Fire residues and contaminated fire extinguishing water must be disposed of in accordance with local regulations.

Special protective equipment for fire-fighters: Self contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing must be worn in case of fire

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

General measures: Mark the danger area. Exposure to heat: have neighbourhood close doors and windows. Exposure to fire/heat: consider evacuation. Wash contaminated clothes.

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures: For non-emergency personnel: For personal protective equipment see section 8. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Avoid breathing vapors or mists. Keep people away from and



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	upwind of spill/leak. Ensure adequate ventilation, especially in confined areas. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. For emergency responders: Personal protection see section "Exposure controls / personal protection".
Environmental precautions:	Prevent further leakage or spillage. Do not discharge product into the aquatic environment without pretreatment (biological treatment plant).
Methods for cleaning up:	Soak up with inert absorbent material. Keep in suitable, closed containers for disposal. If liquid has been spilt in large quantities clean up promptly by scoop or vacuum. Dispose of in accordance with local regulations. Take necessary action to avoid static electricity discharge (which might cause ignition of organic vapours).
